# Teachings of the LDS Church

In the last newsletter, we looked at the history of the LDS prophet, Joseph Smith, and the foundation of the LDS church, seeing ties to the Freemasons and occult practices. In this article, I wish to specifically address the prophet, some of his exaggerated claims, the teachings found within his writings, as well as prophecies that were made.

During his tenure as prophet, Joseph Smith makes numerous outlandish statements. In Doctrine & Covenants (D&C) 132:61-62, Joseph claims that, by divine revelation, God had blessed polygamy, a subject in which the LDS church refers to as plural marriage. In order to strengthen their case in this D&C passage, the LDS church even taught that God had instructed Abram to take Hagar as a wife to conceive Ishmael, while waiting on the promised son. However, even with a superficial reading of the text of Genesis 16, we see that the idea of Hagar conceiving Abram's child is Sarai's idea, never does the Bible mention that God commanded, ordained, or even sanctioned this action. In regards to this situation, we see that God's divine plan is actually recorded in Genesis 17:1-22, that Ishmael was not according to God's will, but rather God was to supernaturally intervene and allow Sarai to have a child when it would be medically, and physically, impossible. Furthermore, God reveals his plan for marriage is to be established between one man and one woman (Genesis 2:24).

Promoting plural marriage, historical records indicate that Joseph Smith would go on to have over 30 wives during his lifetime.1 One of the more notable wives of Joseph was a 14 year old girl by the name of Helen Mar Kimbal. Helen Mar Kimbal was presented with the idea of marrying Joseph Smith by her father, Herbert Kimbal, and Joseph Smith. At the time. Helen disagreed with the idea of plural marriage, or polygamy, but when she reflected on her father's love for her, and when Joseph Smith told her that she and her family, would be eternally saved if she married him,<sup>2</sup> she didn't see any reason

to say no with such high rewards in her mind. Joseph Smith essentially told this 14 year old girl that he could grant her, and her family, salvation *if* she married him.

However, one of the most egregious things that the founding prophet of the LDS church has stated would be late in Joseph Smith's life when so-called Mormon apostates were charging Joseph Smith of false teaching, mainly his doctrine on plural marriage. During an assembly, Joseph Smith addressed a group of dissenters by beginning to compare his time of persecution with that of the apostle Paul: Joseph Smith is on record as saying "I, like Paul, have been in perils, and oftener than anyone in this generation. As Paul boasted, I have suffered more than Paul did."<sup>3</sup> This is certainly a great swelling of

words, but there is more. He goes on with his "boasting" when he states "I have more to boast of than ever any man had. I am the only man that has ever been able to keep a whole church together since the days of Adam. A large majority of the whole have stood by me. Neither Paul, Peter, nor Jesus ever did it. I boast that no man ever did such a work as I. The followers of Jesus ran away from Him; but the Latter-day Saints never ran away from me yet." Wow! There is only one other person I can think of that tries to exalt himself above God, and that is Satan, the father of lies! And yet LDS members are so deceived that they attempt to equate this statement with that of Paul's mention of boasting in 2 Corinthians 11-12, a poor exegete of the text indeed!

The history of the LDS church and the arrogance of its self-proclaimed "prophet" should be enough to discredit the religion as being from God, even when one looks into the teachings within their church along with contradictions within their pages, it is further revealed as a man-made product. First note that the LDS church places their scriptures (Book of Mormon, Doctrines & Covenants, and The Pearl of Great Price) alongside with the Bible. The LDS church teaches the Book of Mormon explains the atoning sacrifice of Jesus Christ and the purpose of this life on earth much clearer than the Bible. To the LDS church, the Bible is insufficient in its witness and application, contrary to what God states in 2 Timothy 3:16-17 that "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." In order to corroborate the Bible's claims, the LDS church states the Book of Mormon is another witness to validate the Bible and to Jesus. Joseph Smith even once said that the Book of Mormon is the most correct book in all the earth (History of the Church, 4:461).

Understanding the LDS stance on their scriptures, and Prophet Joseph Smith, I wish to run them through a two-part test to determine their inerrancy and infallibility. Test one will determine the prophetic accuracy of Joseph Smith while Test two will determine the accuracy of their scripture. Recall that God tells us if a prophet speaks in the name of God and it does not come to pass, he is determined to be a false prophet (Deuteronomy 18:21-22). In other words, one who speaks for God (i.e. a prophet of God such as Joseph Smith claims) must be 100% accurate, 100% of the time. How does the LDS prophet fare?

### Test One:

Prophecy #1: In the History of the Church, Vol 2, p189, it is reported that Jesus Christ's Second Advent would occur in 1891

Actuality #1: It is very much clear that Jesus had not yet returned

Prophecy #2: In Doctrines & Covenants chapter 84, Joseph Smith prophesied that New Jerusalem and the Mormon temple would be built in Missouri before his generation passed on.

Actuality #2: A few years after this prophecy was recorded, the Mormons were chased out of Missouri and remained in Utah, where they are to this day. Furthermore, there is no temple built, nor is New Jerusalem established in the state of Missouri...over 100 years after the passing of this prophecy.

Prophecy #3: In Doctrines & Covenants chapter 87, Joseph prophesied that *all* nations would be involved in the Civil War.

Actuality #3: History reveals that much of the world had no part in the American Civil War.

### Test Two:

Claim #1 Alma 46:15, it is written that believers are called Christians because their belief that Christ would come. In the preface to this chapter, it is said to have been written around 73 B.C.

Contradiction #1: However, the Bible in Acts 11:26 clearly indicates that the disciples of Jesus Christ were first called Christians at Antioch, a few years after Jesus' crucifixion and ascension, sometime in the AD 30s.

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Claim #2 Alma 7:10, it is prophesied that Jesus would be born in Jerusalem

Contradiction #2: This is entirely inaccurate as the Bible prophesied that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2) and the Bible records this fulfillment in the synoptic Gospels; furthermore, Bethlehem is miles away from Jerusalem.

Claim #3 2 Nephi 25:23, it states that one is saved by grace after all that we do [emphasis mine].

Contradiction #3: This is in disagreement with the Bible for in Ephesians 2:8-9 we read "For grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast" Contending 4 Christ Issue #4

So there you have it, the prophet and the scriptures both failed the tests historically and prophetically. What the LDS church has is not the word of God, given as another witness to Jesus Christ, but rather a work of a man, giving his testimony about the Jesus with whom he believes. Neither the Book of Mormon, Doctrines & Covenants, or Pearl of Great Price has any life-saving efficacy within its pages, but only a theology derived from a finite man. When we come to any other teachings that contradict the word of God, or claim to be another witness to, we must do as the Bereans and search out those things to determine whether they are so (Acts 17:11). And when we look into the claims of the LDS church, we find a fallible work by man. The only book given by God is the Holy Bible, which has always stood the test historically, scientifically, and prophetically. "The grass withereth, the flower fadeth: but the word of our God shall stand for ever." (Isaiah 40:8).

In light of all this remember that LDS members are sinners that Jesus Christ died for upon the cross, just like you and I. Unfortunately, they are being deceived by those transformed as ministers of righteousness (2 Corinthians 11:14-15) to believe in their works for eternal salvation, which will never atone for their sins. We must be ready, and willing, as led by the Spirit, to deliver them the gospel of grace through faith which leads to repentance and salvation. May the Lord use us to know His truth and preach His truth to a world seeking salvation by their own accord.


